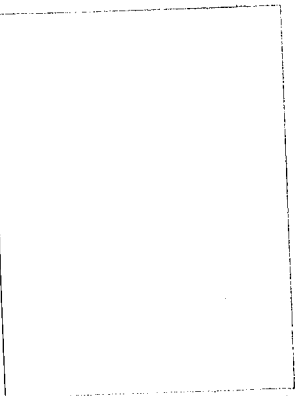
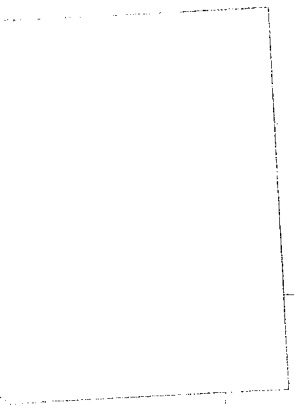

ON APPOINTING A COMMITTEE FOR ADVERTISING

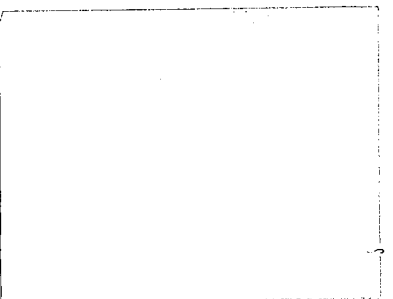
