

RESOLUTION NO. 2000-42
RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A LOWER SPEED LIMIT
ON SHAFTER ROAD NEAR GREENFIELD
IN WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE

WHEREAS, a petition has been presented to the Weakley County Board of Highway Commissioners at their March 9, 2000 meeting for the purpose of reducing the speed limit on a county road.

WHEREAS, this petition is requesting the speed limit on Shafter Road near Greenfield be lowered from 55 m.p.h. to 45 m.p.h. from this day forward.

WHEREAS, a need has arisen for the lower speed limit due to Shafter Road being a shortcut between Highway 54 and Highway 124 making it a highly traveled road and much traffic congestion due to a ballfield near Bethel Church.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the county legislative body of Weakley County, Tennessee assembled in regular session on this the 20th day of March, 2000 in Dresden, Tennessee that this resolution is hereby approved.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the Board of County Commissioners of Weakley County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed and it is agreed that Shafter Road speed limit be 45 m.p.h. from this day forward.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Board of County Commissioners.
