

RESOLUTION NO. 1973-15:RESOLUTION FIXING THE TAX LEVY IN  
WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, FOR THE  
FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 1973.

SECTION 1. BE IT RESOLVED by the Quarterly Court of Weakley County, Tennessee, assembled in Regular session on this 9th day of July, 1973 that the combined property tax rate for Weakley County, Tennessee, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1973, shall be \$2.73 on each \$100.00 of taxable property, which is to provide revenue for each of the following funds and otherwise conform to the following levies:

SECTION 2. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that there is hereby levied a gross receipt tax as provided by law. The proceeds of the gross receipts tax herein levied shall accrue to the County General Fund on an \_\_\_\_\_ basis.

SECTION 3. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all resolutions of the Quarterly Court of Weakley County, Tennessee, which are in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution take effect from and after its passage, the public welfare requiring it. This resolution shall be spread upon the minutes of the Quarterly Court Court.

Passed this 9th day of July, 1973.

WHEREAS, Chapter No. 533 of the Public Acts of the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee for the year 1972 provides that county courts of each county in the state shall have the authority and duty to fix jailers' fees at an amount not less than two dollars (\$2.00) per day; provided, however, that the same may be fixed to allow up to an additional two dollars (\$2.00) per day in any county where the prisoner records meet the minimum standards, prescribed by the Comptroller of the Treasury; and,

RESOLUTION NO. 1973-16:

WHEREAS, WEAKLEY COUNTY meets said minimum standards, and it is the desire of the Weakley County Quarterly Court to fix the jailers' fees in accordance with provisions of Section 8-2507, et sec., of the Tennessee Code Annotated.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE QUARTERLY COUNTY COURT OF WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE, That the jailers' fees for Weakley County be and the same are hereby fixed in accordance with the provisions of Section 8-2507, et sec., of the Tennessee Code Annotated, at Four (\$4.00) Dollars PER PRISONER per day for each twenty-four (24) hour period a prisoner if confined in the Weakley County Jail.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED AND ORDERED, That the Weakley County Court Clerk promptly transmit a certified copy of the Resolution to the Judicial Cost Accountant of the State of Tennessee, Nashville, Tennessee, as required by the provisions of Section 8-2508, Tennessee Code Annotated."

Whereupon, passage of the resolution was moved by Esq. R. H. Pearson, duly seconded by Esq. R. A. Bell. Chairman E. W. Wheeling inquired if there were any objections to voting on the motion. There were no objections, and the resolution was adopted by the following vote:

RESOLUTION  
OF THE

WHEREAS, the State Legislature of Tennessee has passed Public Act. Chapter No. 806, Senate Bill No. 1727

Creating the Obion-Forked Deer River Basin Authority, for the purpose of developing a unified effort on the part of the counties of Northwest Tennessee, consisting of Dyer, Lake, Lauderdale, Haywood, Crockett, Madison, Obion, Henry, Weakley, Carroll, Henderson, Chester, McNairy, and Gibson to initiate and develop plans approved by said counties, State, and Federal Agencies:

WHEREAS, it is for the benefit of the said counties to participate under the Obion-Forked Deer River Basin Act passed by said Legislature of State of Tennessee, a copy of the Act being hereto attached setting forth the purposes of said Act and duties of the directors of the "Authority".
