Prayer was offered by Professor F. Y. Fuqua whereupon Court was opened in regular order by Sheriff Tom Grooms.

The following proceedings were had to wit:

Paul Moore, new magistrate for the Eighth District was introduced to other members of the Quarterly Court he followed Mr. Albert Hudson. Esquire Dalton Glover and John Boaz returned from the Armed Forces of the United States.

Esquire C. C. Underwood tendered his resignation as County Surveyor and asked that a new man be elected by the January, 1946 session of the Quarterly meeting of the Weakley County Court. Esquire Underwood has served in the capacity of County Surveyor for the past thirty-two years and has expressed the desire to end his services effective January 1, 1946, not for re-election since he has held this position as long as he has been physically able to do so.

Tom Irvine, Manager of the Weakley County Veterans Information Service Center, made a report of his services rendered during the past quarter helping veterans both of World War I and World War II. This report included employment placement, insurance benefits and other governmental aids.
