

IN THE WEAKLEY COUNTY QUARTERLY COURT

APRIL TERM, 1944

Be it remembered that at a meeting of the Weakley County Finance Committee, Friday, March 24th, 1944, the matter of initiating plans for the remodeling or rebuilding of a new Court House in Dresden was discussed,

And Whereas, the committee is of the opinion that there should be plans set in order for consideration of this matter, that the present Court House is in need of repairs and is inadequate and does not meet the present day needs of the County,

And Whereas, the committee is advised that there will be funds from the National government during the post war building program available to the County for the purpose of assisting in matters of this character and to supply work for all our citizens:

Be it Therefore Resolved, by the Weakley County Quarterly Court now assembled, that the County Judge name a committee of five, whose duty it shall be to look into this matter, make whatever investigations are necessary, and keep the Court properly advised relative to this building program.

It is further suggested by the Committee that an appropriation of \$500.00 be made at this Term of Court to pay the expenses of this investigation, including a fee to the architect, which fee shall be the amount recommended by the members of this Committee.
