A RESOLUTION

TO THE WEAKLEY COUNTY QUARTERLY COURT:

We, the members of your Beer Committee, hereby recommend certain rules and policies be established in the issuance of permits to sell beer in Weakley County.

We have diligently endeavored to administer the law in these matters, notwithstanding the fact that many good people do not understand the law, and in some instances we have no doubt been criticized, never-the-less, we have, on the advice of our attorney, M. Harry Jones, gone ahead as we have understood the law, issuing many permits to citizens who, as we thought, were qualified to sell beer under the present laws regulating the sale of beer in this state.

There are certain rules that we think should be established in this matter-- they are as follows:

First: We think no petition to obtain a license to sell beer in Weakley County should be passed on until it has been filed with the commission at least thirty days.

Second: We think that each applicatn should be required to pay the sum of \$12.00, which amount is what it cost the county for the beer commission to meet to consider their application.

Third: We do not think that a license should be granted any person in the county until the magistrates in the district where the beer business will be located, have been notified by the County Court Clerk and they have an opportunity to advise with the people of the community and to check the standing and reputation of such persons who apply for beer permits.

We strongly request that any citizen of the county who know of any of the rules and regulations of the selling of beer in the county that are being disobeyed to the extent that any place is becomming a neusance or a place of bad influence in the community, that we be notified of all the facts. We are more than anxious to see the law carried out in these matters and will, and hereby do pledge our efforts to see that no community is mistreated and no bad influence is practiced in this county.

We recommend the adoption of this statement of facts.
