

DEAN GROOMS made the following stated motion in regard to segregation:
 BE IT RESOLVED by the Weakley County Quarterly Court in session duly assembled on this the 7th day of Jan. 1957, that we resolved that segregation be continued in our public schools and
 WHEREAS, the General Assembly of the State of Tenn. is now in session at Nashville, and
 WHEREAS, the magistrates of said Court desire to go on record as favoring segregation and of
 continuin the same as our way of life in Weakley County, Tennessee, and
 WHEREAS, various bills will be introduced in the Gen. Ass. concerning segregation in our
 Public Schools and
 WHEREAS, the magistrates desire to express their ideas on this issue to the Senators and
 Representatives representing Weakley County in Nashville, Tennessee.
 BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT Weakley County Court favors segregation in Public Schools and
 respectfully request our Senators and Representatives to vote for legislation to this end. The Clerk
 of this court is directed to mail a copy of this Resolution to our Senators and Representative in
 Nashville.
 Motion was seconded by Esq. Hillman Westbrook. Unanimously approved.

Motion made to adjourn whereupon court adjourned until court in cause.
