

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the State of Tennessee at the 1951 Session of the Legislature passed an anti-rabies law requiring all dogs to be inoculated by October 31, 1951, the law to be applicable to all counties where the Quarterly County Court has passed a resolution by a majority of such Court expressly approving the application of the law, and,

WHEREAS, Rabies has become increasingly dangerous to both human beings and domestic animals of our County, and,

WHEREAS, we deem the adoption of the State anti-rabies law <sup>Rabies law</sup> to be anti-beneficial to the General Health and Welfare of our people, now,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Quarterly County Court of Weakley County, Tennessee, expressly approves the application of the anti-rabies law of the State of Tennessee passed at the 1951 Session of the General Assembly.
