

Col. Corbitt talked to the Court about the Fire Prevention Program in regard to soil conversation. He pointed out that 22% of Weakley County is in Woodland. He also said that a survey was made two years ago and it was found that 23,000 acres are badly corroded. He thinks that Weakley County would need ~~XXXXXX~~ Forrest Fire Control Program if trees are planted as they should be.

He introduced Jack Fox, District Forrester from Lexington. He told how they would locate the tower so the entire county could be seen. He said his survey shows that the biggest percentage of fires start from 9:00 in the morning between 4:30 in the afternoon. He also stated that local men would be hired and trained to take part in this program. He explained that at the present time there is one tractor to two counties and plans are being made to have a tractor for each county.

Motion made by Seldon Parham for Weakley County to make appropriation of \$2000.00 for Weakley County to be admitted to the Forrest Fire Prevention Program when the state can so arrange it, seconded by Esq. Neal Tillman.
