

REGULAR MEETING OF THE COUNTY COMMISSION
JANUARY 19, 1993

The regular meeting of the county commission met in regular session with Co. Exec. Kerry Killebrew calling the meeting to order. Invocation was held by Comm. Joe Brasher and Sheriff Mike Wilson opened the Court. The pledge was given by the entire court and County Clerk Faye Butts with 18 members present. Two were absent, they being Comm. James H. Bell and Comm. George Broussard. Approval of the minutes of regular meeting of 10-19-92 and Special Session 12-15-92 was made by Comm. David McAlpin and seconded by Comm. Vernon Dunn. After a voice vote, motion carried.

SCHOOL TRUSTEE, GENERAL FUND, HIGHWAY DEPT. REPORT: Motion to accept all four of these reports were made by Comm. Vernon Dunn and seconded by Comm. Earl Wright. After a voice vote, motion carried.

AMBULANCE COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Earl Wright, chairman, reported that all was going well and they were looking for a good spring. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. Dunn and seconded by Comm. Brasfield. After a voice vote, motion carried.

NO BUDGET REPORT:

HEW REPORT: Comm. Vincent reported to the court that the committee has met on the Waste Planning Session and it is proceeding. The Committee elected their officers and will have more meetings. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. Roger VanCleave and seconded by Comm. J. T. Walker. After a voice vote, motion carried.

FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT: Comm. Dunn, chairman, reported that they met with Buddy Carpenter, new financial director, and said all was going smooth. Motion to accept this report was made by Comm. Joe Brasher and seconded by Comm. Richard Phebus. After a voice vote, motion carried.

NO LAW ENFORCEMENT REPORT;


NURSING HOME REPORT: David McBride, Adm. of the Weakley County Nursing Home expressed his concern for the lack of applicants to fill nursing positions at the facility. The lack of adequate training facilities was cited as the problem. This situation was addressed by the Commissioners. Comm. David McAlpin made a motion that Co. Exec. Killebrew, School Supt. Richard Barber and Vol. School Adm. Mark Maddox ask Rep. Roy Herron and Senator John Tanner to lend their support and help in this problem. After a voice vote, motion carried.

CHAMBER OF COMMERCE REPORT: Suzanne Speight, Exec. Director, reported on the county's progress over the past year and outlined a plan for the coming year.

RANDY MCGILL spoke to the Commissioners concerning the county's addressing system. He stated that basically, Weakley County is on the bottom of the list of eight counties awaiting approval of addressing by the Regional Post Office in Memphis. Once the new addressing system gets underway, Bob Spellings of the Emergency Management will assume the responsibility of maintaining the necessary updates to the systems.

Co. Exec. Killebrew reported that an official unveiling of the new portrait for the courthouse would take place at 10:00 a.m. on February 5 and will be part of the Tennessee Bicentennial in 1996. Each one was invited to attend this event.
