

RESOLUTION NO. 1995-91

**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING BUDGET AMENDMENTS TO THE WEAKLEY COUNTY,
TENNESSEE, EDUCATION CAPITAL PROJECTS FUND FOR THE FISCAL YEAR
ENDING JUNE 30, 1996.**

WHEREAS, Weakley County, Tennessee did appoint land holders to a Jury of View in regards to land currently under consideration for purchase of the building site for the K-8 School in Dresden,

AND WHEREAS, the Jury of View did establish fair values of the land for a total amount of \$257,500.00,

AND WHEREAS, those events having occurred require adjustments in the 1995-96 Fiscal Year of the Weakley County Educational Capital Projects Fund,


