The Weakley County Rules Committee met on Wednesday, October 27, 2021, at 9:00 a.m. in the conference room at the Board of Education in Dresden. Others present included County Mayor Jake Bynum, Finance Director John Liggett, CTAS representative Mike Galey, Election Commission Alex Britt, Commissioners Beth VanCleave and Larry Kelly, and one representative of the media.

I.-II. CALL TO ORDER – APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Chairperson Hawks called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m. and asked for consideration of the minutes from the meeting that was held on September 21, 2021. CTAS representative Mike Galey asked that one slight correction be made. Commissioner Owen made the motion to approve if the change is made, and with a second by Commissioner Donaldson, the motion passed unanimously.

III. OLD BUSINESS

CTAS Representative Mike Galey informed the committee that there was one change he forgot to mention during the last meeting. The area includes 9 people off of Tyler Austin road. They were in district seven but with the adjustments they would be in district six. The committee could vote not to include that change and keep the nine individuals in district seven. Commissioner Hawks mentioned that since residents can now vote anywhere these 9 people being moved should not make much of a difference.

Commissioner Owen made a motion to further discuss and make a decision on the redistricting plan and with a second from Commissioner Hawks the motion passed unanimously.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

Resolution No. 2022-15

Commissioner Doster made a motion to approve the resolution and adopt the proposed redistricting plan and with a second from Commissioner Eddings the motion passed unanimously.


V. Other business
