

RESOLUTION TO REQUEST LEGISLATION LEVYING A WHEEL TAX

WHEREAS, the cost of providing quality education in the public school system has increased rastically; and,

WHEREAS, the expense of maintaining the county road system has become so great as to leave no additional funds for the construction and repair of the county's bridges, highways, and culverts; and,

WHEREAS, the levying of a wheel tax on the privilege of operating motor vehicles over the county roads would provide much needed revenue for the county

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Weakley County Quarterly Court that:
SECTION 1. The legislative delegation representing Weakley County is requested to seek passage of legislation levying a wheel tax for Weakley county.

SECTION 2. That the Weakley County Quarterly Court request the Weakley County Election Commission to call a referendum immediately to determine the desire of the qualified voters regarding the levying of said wheel tax.
