

BE IT ENACTED BY THE WEAKLEY COUNTY QUARTERLY COURT OF WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE ASSEMBLED THE 13th DAY OF JANUARY, 1975

A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF A PLANNED INSTALLATION, KNOW AS AN "AGRICULTURE PAVILION," TO BE CONSTRUCTED ON THE CAMPUS OF THE UNIVERSITY OF TENNESSEE AT MARTIN, IN THE CITY OF MARTIN IN WEAKLEY COUNTY, TENNESSEE.

RESOLVED

Whereas, the University of Tennessee at Martin, in the city of Martin in Weakley County, Tennessee, desires to construct an installation to be known as an "Agriculture Pavilion" for the educational or instructional purpose as may be required in the agriculture or academic curriculum of the University of Tennessee at Martin, and for the housing of exhibits, exhibitions, shows or events, and

WHEREAS, the Weakley County Quarterly Court, duly assembled, and representative of the seven zones of Weakley County, Tennessee, do affirm the program of the University of Tennessee at Martin and institutes its full and complete support and influence on behalf of its thirty thousand Weakley Countians for the Construction of the proposed Agriculture Pavilion, and

WHEREAS, the Weakley County Quarterly Court fully realizes and is well aware of the importance of Agriculture to Weakley County and the State of Tennessee. As the number one industry of the area, Agriculture Provides Jobs, Food, Clothing, Housing, and other essential goods for hundreds of thousand of Tennesseans and the continuation of the Agriculture Program for and of this area is absolutely essential to the well-being of Tennesseans, and

WHEREAS, public funds of the State of Tennessee, together with Public Subscriptions, donations and contributions, are required for the actual construction of the Agriculture Pavilion. Capital funds to be provided for the project must be appropriated by the Legislature of the State of Tennessee from the 1975-76 budget of the State, now

THEREFORE, be it further resolved by the Weakley County Quarterly Court of Weakley County, Tennessee, to request of the Governor, the Commissioner of Agriculture, Members of the Senate and House of Representatives of the 89th General Assembly, adequate funding of the proposed "Agriculture Pavilion" and to make know this request by serving a copy of this resolution on each named herein, and
