

RESOLUTION NO. 1995-103

A RESOLUTION TO REQUEST THE COUNTY ATTORNEY AND THE ATTORNEY OF RECORD IN THE CASE OF OLDS, ADAMS, AND RAMTHUN VS. WEAKLEY COUNTY ET. AL. TO NEGOTIATE A SETTLEMENT WITH THE PARTIES OF THE ABOVE STYLED CASE AND TO REPORT BACK TO THE COUNTY COMMISSION AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE TIME IN REGARD TO ANY SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT.

WHEREAS, in the court case of Olds, Adams, and Ramthun vs. Weakley County et al, a settlement prior to the case being heard in court is a possibility, and

WHEREAS, the Weakley County Commission desires to settle this matter in a manner which is fair and equitable to all parties in the shortest possible time,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE WEAKLEY COUNTY COMMISSION MEETING IN REGULAR SESSION ON NOVEMBER 20, 1995, as follows:

SECTION 1. The Weakley County Commission directs the county attorney, in consultation with Mr. James Glasgow, Sr., the attorney of record in the above styled case, to move toward an out-of-court settlement in the case of Olds, Adams, and Ramthun vs. Weakley County et. al. which will be fair and equitable to all parties concerned.

SECTION 2. The Weakley County Commission further directs the county attorney to report back to the chairman of the legislative committee at the earliest possible time on the results of this effort to obtain a settlement in this case.

SECTION 3. This resolution shall become effective upon passage, the public welfare requiring it.
