

RESOLUTION NO. 1974-5 (CONTINUED)

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that ninety-five (95) per cent of the total expenditure will be reimbursed from Federal funds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Quarterly County Court of Weakley County, Tennessee, as follows:

SECTION 1. That, for the purpose of providing funds for the initial purchase of communication and transportation equipment for the Sheriff's Office and county jail, there shall be issued a negotiable interest bearing capital outlay note of Weakley County, Tennessee, in an amount not exceeding \$43,360.00. That said note shall be designated "Capital Outlay Note". Said note shall mature not later than three (3) years from date of issuance.

SECTION 2. That, said note shall bear interest at a rate not in excess of 6 per cent (6%) per annum, payable semi-annually each six months after date of issuance. Both principal of and interest on said note shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America at the office of the Weakley County, Trustee, Dresden, Tennessee. The county reserves the right to pay said note, in whole or in part, at any time with accrued interest to date of said payment.

SECTION 3. That, the full faith and credit of Weakley County is pledged for payment of principal and interest it is expressly understood that all such payments are to be made from the County General Fund of Weakley County.

SECTION 4. That, said note shall be executed and signed in the name of Weakley County, Tennessee, by the County Judge and attested by the County Court Clerk, with the seal of the County attached thereto.
